Faith vs Works

Session Objectives: To help us realize the necessary balance of faith and works. One without the other does not benefit us in our walk with God. Resources:

MESSAGE NOTES

- 1. See the **folly** of works and the **power** of faith.
 - Religion is Jesus <u>and</u>..., faith is <u>simply</u> Jesus.
- 2. Internal motivations reveal your path.
 - Works are motivated by <u>fear</u> & <u>obligation</u>.
 - Faith is motivated by <u>celebration</u> & gratitude.
- 3. Jesus broke the <u>curse</u> of sin by becoming a <u>curse</u>.

"For our sake He (God) made Him (Jesus) to be sin who knew no sin, so that in Him (Jesus) we might become the righteousness of God." **2 Corinthians 5:21**

When we have fallen victim to the lies that "faith is not enough, we should be doing something more to earn it", how do we bring ourselves back from living those lies? Consider **Ephesians 2:8-10** in your answer.

This week, let's not be the ones who speak about our faith and do not live it. What can you do to put your faith into action?

"For it was indeed fitting that we should have such a high priest, holy, innocent, unstained, separated from sinners, and exalted above the heavens. For the law appoints men in their weakness as high priests, but the word of the oath, which came later than the law, appoints a Son who has been made perfect forever." **Heb 7:26-28**
